## TREASURERS REPORT - 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021

## **Summary**

Revenue of \$105,227 and total expenses of \$85,690 resulted in a net profit for the year of \$19,537 – favourable by \$16,529 or 549.7% improvement on last year. Increase registrations, BBQ & uniform sales attributed to the increase from prior year.

Total Cash Balance as @ 31<sup>st</sup> March 2021 was \$122,881.06, an increase of \$13,408.75 or 11% on prior year. A great result considering COVID impacts felt across Australia.

## **Revenues**

This year the main sources of revenue for the club were registrations, BBQ takings and Uniform sales. Other revenue streams included volunteer fees, non-helping fees and registrations fees to help offset the zone, region & state costs that the club incurs each year.

Total Net revenue was \$105,227 compared to \$94,925 in FY20 resulting to a year on year decrease of 10.9% on the previous year.

Main drivers of movements were as follows:

- o ESLAC Registrations increase by \$6,823, a 13% increase on last year
- o BBQ revenue has increase 24% from prior year due to purchase of EPFOS machine to mitigate the impact of increasing cashless sales
- Uniform sales increased by \$2,335, a 15% increase on last year
- Carnival registration fees reallocated to Volunteer & Coaching fees to consolidate accounts

## **Expenses**

The main driver of costs for FY20 were Ground fees of \$20,494 which showed an increase of 2,400 or 9%. Coaching \$19,535 – decrease of \$2400 or 11% to previous financial year, Helpers costs \$11,017 – increase of \$2,427 or 28% from prior year, Clothing for Regionals & State were \$1,751 – decrease of 13,171 or 88% from prior year.

Main drivers of movements were as follows:

- Uniform expenses up from prior year, however offset by an increase in sales
- Ground fees increase of \$1,688 driven by late invoice processing by Centennial parklands
- BBQ costs of \$5,354 now classified as expenses previously offset against Revenue.
  Overall, BBQ fees are down due to 3 nights cancelled this season.
